

PADDLE RACK and “TWO IN/TWO OUT” SYSTEM

To accommodate the continued growth of pickleball within Canadian Lakes, while preserving the social aspects of the game, we utilize a Paddle Rack and “Two In/Two Out” system. This ensures a first come, first served usage of the CLPOC courts. When the courts are full, singles play is strongly discouraged.

- The paddle rack is located near the pavilion, and holds 20 paddles.
- A player arrives at the paddle rack, places his/her paddle in the rack in any open slot, in any order, behind other placed paddles, from right to left.
- After placing their paddle in the consolidated paddle rack, players should wait in the pavilion area until there is an open court.
- When a court becomes available, players should access their court via the appropriate end. Courts 1 & 2 and 7 & 8 are accessed via the east end. Courts 3 & 4 and 5 & 6 are accessed via the west end.
- Players completing a game should exit at the same end from which they entered. *Note: If there is an empty court, players do not have to relinquish their court when games reach their end, even if players are waiting.*
- When a game is complete, the winners may remain on the court and separate. The non-winners will come out. The players belonging to the next two paddles in the rack, will join the previous winners for a new game. *Note: If a player has been on the court for two consecutive games, then that player must also come out, in which case the next three players will join the one remaining player.*
- Games are played to 11. If players are waiting for a court, it's win by one. If no one is waiting, it's win by two.
